Blood Panels: In our industry, Blood Panels are used to diagnose why sick horses are not feeling well and to screen for early disease conditions which are still not clinically apparent. With a simple blood test, we can check for infections, anemia, and parasite migration. We can also screen many of the vital organs in the horse's body such as liver, kidneys, and muscle.

In some cases, early intervention on developing diseases will greatly diminish the amount of time, money, and effort required to control the disease as compared to waiting until the full clinical disease develops. In cases where all the tested parameters (about 40) come back normal, the panel is still valuable. These results can provide an important baseline for your horse to compare to, if it ever should get sick.

Sample collection involves drawing 6 to 10 cc's of blood from the horse's vein and test results are available in 3 to 5 days. A copy of the test results can be mailed to you for your records if you desire.

Microchips: Microchips are an important tool to provide positive identification of your horse. It is important to realize that they do not act like a "Lo-Jack" and help you find your horse if it is stolen, but it will allow you to positively identify your horse once it is found. This can be vitally important in cases of horse evacuations during natural disasters or in the event your horse is stolen.

The microchip is implanted under the skin, typically on the side of the neck, and is about the size of a grain of rice. It sits dormant until it is stimulated by a reader and then it sends back a specific code which is unique to each microchip.

It is possible to subscribe to services through the microchip company where they will keep your information on file and notify you if someone scans the chip on your lost or stolen horse. This service is vital for dogs, cats, and even birds which escape frequently, but is used less for horses. However, if you are ever faced with the problem of proving the "big bay gelding" standing in the corner is your horse that was lost two years ago, then having a microchip placed in your horse was a great idea.
